Responsibilities:

1. Working with the Project Air Team in a dynamic university and health outreach environment on collaborative activities to progress the strategy
2. Assist with running workshops, various training activities and participating in psychological consultations at identified community and hospital settings concerning personality disorder treatment and management
3. Developing clinical resources, treatment manuals and educational materials to progress project deliverables
4. Undertake research activities as required including interviewing and limited clinical treatment or consultation, data collection, statistical analysis, writing reports, and publications

Although the position is based at the University, flexible working conditions including working remotely and travel are negotiable.
